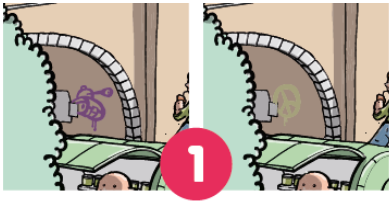


# The 12 differences

At least half of all movies, TV series and documentaries aired by European channels and other companies broadcasting in the EU must be made in the EU.



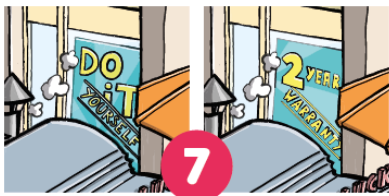
The EU has put a stop to geoblocking: EU citizens can now buy and sell products and services in any EU member state.



In order to decrease the number of smokers, the EU has prohibited tobacco advertising. It also determines which warnings are placed on the packaging of cigarettes and tobacco.



When you need the police or another form of emergency assistance, you can call the same European emergency number 112 regardless of the member state you are in.



The EU has determined that you should get at least 2 years warranty on every electronic appliance available for purchase.



Since 2002 we use the euro. It is the official currency in 19 EU member states.



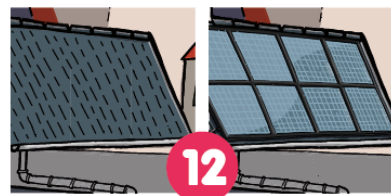
The borders of the EU member states are open to a free movement of persons, goods, services and capital. In most EU countries the borders are also open to travelling EU citizens.



The EU prohibits discrimination in the workplace based on someone's gender, age, disability, race or ethnic origin, religion, conviction or sexual orientation. Non-discrimination is therefore an important value in the EU.



The Erasmus+ programme offers a scholarship to students in the EU who spend a period time during their studies studying in a different EU member state.



The European Union works towards a better climate. That is why by 2030 at least 32% of our consumed energy has to come from renewable energy sources.
